




Maltese Ruby Tiger Moth

This moth is found only on the Maltese Islands. It is very hairy when it's a small caterpillar and hairy as an adult moth as well. It is named after its vivid red colour!








Maltese Door Snail




Maltese Honey Bee




Maltese Wall Lizard




Maltese Field Beetle




Maltese Fresh Water Crab






Painted Frog


There is a particular painted frog which is found only on the Maltese Islands and Sicily, and it is also the only amphibian species found naturally on our islands! They are protected by law which means they shouldn't be caught and taken from their home in the wild.

Maltese Spurge Hawkmoth

This moth is found only on the Maltese Islands and is named after the spurge plant which the caterpillar lives on before it turns into a moth. It's mostly found in rocky garigue areas where you can find a lot of spurge.



Maltese-Trap Door Spider

This type of spider is protected since it can only be found on the Maltese Islands. It lives for many years and lives in holes or tunnels in soil. It gets its name since it closes its home with a kind of door made out of soil and silk!
