We call it the Drop Off Zone.




Esplora has blue-badge parking outside of the drop-off zone and Heritage Malta.

This is what the spaces look like.




You can enter Esplora by going up the escalator.

You will get your ticket from here.


At Esplora there will be other people visiting, That is OK.

If you are sensitive to loud sounds, please ask our staff to borrow a pair.




There are fire exit signs around Esplora.

In this area, all of the exhibits are about motion.




Some of the exhibits have buttons which you can press.

Press the button once and see what happens.




Some exhibits have wheels to turn.



You pull the ropes on this exhibit.




You can try to blow the ball through the hoops on this exhibit.

You can look at different cells through this microscope.




This exhibit will show you how far your food travels.


It has a touch screen, small solar panels, and mini cars.



This room has exhibits all about Electricity.




This is what our Plasma ball looks like close-up, don't worry it doesn't hurt at all.

You can hit the pipes with the paddles and hear different notes come out of each pipe.




You will walk along the piano exhibit to go to the next room.

These exhibits are puzzles.


You have to think and experiment to get them right.

In this room, you can create your own firework display, and learn about molicules and element.




This is the Media Room.

This is what it looks like inside esploracafé.




You can buy food and drinks at esploracafé.

There are many tables and comfortable chairs you can sit on.




This is outside the Activity Centre.



You can try to get the balls all around the room by using screw pipes, wheelbarrows, cranes and the air pipe system.






This is the Multisensory Room.



The seats lay back so that you can see the show on the dome screen overhead





Other times, one of the explainers from Esplora would talk to us about planets and stars.









You can walk across a bridge in the Adventure Park.




You can play on the Zip Line in the Adventure Park.
